

Mabel Ping Mua-Lee was a Chinese-American suffragette who led her first suffrage parade in New York in 1912 at the age of 16. Using her freedoms of assembly, speech, and press, she rode a horse leading the parade carrying a banner, and wrote essays promoting equality in The Chinese Students Monthly. After women won the right to vote with the passing of the 19th Amendment, Mua-Lee was still not allowed to vote due to the 1882 Chinese Exclusion Act.
